a. Universal and correct wearing of <u>masks</u> ;	· Masks are required for students while on school provided transportation.

· Masking rules will be reviewed and modified based on state guidance and final board decisions.

· Masks will be worn, by students, at parents' discretion.

· Faculty and staff will wear masks at their own discretion.

· School visitors will be asked to wear masks when appropriate.

b. Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);

- Desks have approximately three feet of separation among students and staff as feasible
- Students in grades K-5 will have limited transitions when feasible.
- Encourage social distancing when feasible
- Congregating in hallways, restrooms, and other areas will not be permitted
- The music program including band and chorus will continue with protocols that will be developed to adhere to health and safety guidelines
- K-12 Students will eat in the cafeteria in smaller groups and adhere to social distancing guidelines, when possible.
- Students may be required to eat in small groups in areas other than the cafeteria, to allow for appropriate spacing
- K-12 physical education classes will be designed to incorporate social distancing guidelines and will occur outside whenever possible to maximize the level of adherence to social distancing guidelines
- Recess and elementary physical education will happen in multiple outdoor locations whenever possible to best adhere to social distancing and hygiene guidelines. Indoor physical education and recess activities will be conducted in the classroom in the case of inclement weather
- Each student will have a set of individual learning resources

<p>c. <u>Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;</u></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">· Promote healthy hygiene practices such as hand washing (20 seconds with warm water and soap)· Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the school facility· Signs to promote everyday protection measures and hygiene will be posted in hallways and classrooms in highly-visible areas

d. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation;

- Up-to-date no-touch drinking fountain
- Surface disinfection will occur in classrooms on a regular basis.
- Bathrooms will be cleaned and disinfected
 - Regular cleaning of doors, floors, and other high-touch and high-use areas
 - Surface disinfection will occur between each lunch period in the cafeteria
 - Frequent use of electrostatic sprayers to disinfect bathrooms, classrooms, and other high-use areas
 - Update HVAC system to control outside air flow
 - Clean locker rooms and sports facilities daily
 - Training of custodial staff on effective cleaning procedures
 - Install tile flooring and removal of carpet wherever possible and feasible
 - Buses will be cleaned and sanitized

e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;

Contact tracing will occur in accordance with the Pennsylvania Department of Health. As soon as the district is informed of a positive COVID 19 case the school nurse will contact all identified persons/students that meet the definition of an exposure. A parent/guardian will be notified as quickly as possible about the exposure and a return date depending on if it is a general exposure versus a household exposure will be established and communicated at that time.

Positive test result: The individual should stay home at least 10 days from the positive test result date and until he/she is fever and symptom free for at least three days without medication.

Exposed Siblings and household members should also stay home for 20 days from each positive test date. The parent/guardian will correspond with the School Nurse to establish a safe return date and or discuss immunization and whether a quarantine is needed. .

Negative test result but symptoms with no other diagnosis: The individual should stay home at least 10 days from the onset of symptoms and until he/she is fever and symptom free for at least 3 days without medication. The parent or guardian should correspond with the School Nurse to establish a safe return date for siblings/ household members.

For an individual with a COVID-19 diagnosis without a lab test or an individual with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 without a medical evaluation: The individual should stay home at least 10 days from the onset of symptoms and until he/she is fever and symptom free for at least 3 days without medication. Siblings and household members should also stay home until the parent or guardian has corresponded with the School Nurse to establish a safe return date.

Positive antibody levels are currently acceptable to negate a quarantine. Those results would need submitted to the school nurse prior to the exposed student returning to school or riding the bus. Results can be faxed or emailed for immediate nurse approval.

While the Pennsylvania Department of Health continues to recommend a 14 day quarantine after a general exposure (not a household exposure) a test out option has been offered. If an exposed individual tests for COVID 19 on day 5 of exposure and tests negative, that individual can return on day 7 if the results are turned into the school nurse and if that individual remains symptom free. Return can also follow 10 days after a general exposure

	(not a household exposure) if the individual is unable to test at day 5.
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f. Diagnostic and screening testing;

· Parents should monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 and routinely perform temperature checks on their children each morning before sending them to school. Any student exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms or a temperature greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit should stay home. In that instance, students should remain home until they are fever-free (without medication) and symptom free for 48 hours

· As students arrive at school in the morning, symptom monitoring and temperature checks may be conducted at our buildings' points of entry.

Students with temperatures greater than or equal to 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit will be immediately placed in isolation so that arrangements can be made for him or her to return home

· Our staff will be educated by the School Nurse on signs and symptoms of concern and their duty in reporting to the nurse immediately

· If a member of the staff or student body comes to school with suspected signs and symptoms of COVID-19, he/she will be kept in isolation under the supervision of the nurse until arrangements are made to return home.

· Parents and guardians must inform the nurse immediately, and before sending a child to school, if the child or any family member in the child's household tests

Students with documented health issues that could be negatively impacted by the wearing of a mask/face covering are not required to wear masks at any time provided they present a valid physician's note.

This information will be shared with the Health & Safety Committee and School Board in an effort to update this plan.


